Throughout the meeting the project partners discussed a variety of topics among which the most important aspect was that of the curricula of the euWeld courses, which was discussed in detail. The first version of the curricula was created and disseminated among the partners for thorough review.

Also the content for euWeld course and the e-learning content were discussed and the partners decided upon the topics to be developed by each of them.

During the meeting, the partners from Malta and

UK made demonstrations of using virtual reality for welding.

Also the partners decided upon the three learning activities in Romania, Slovenia and UK to be reduced to 5 days instead of 15 and 10 days .
